This letter is to confirm that the Juvenile Justice Section of the Department of Public safety has awarded funding up to \$50,000 to Forsyth County to support the development of community based services providing alternatives to referring juveniles to court for school based behaviors. There is no requirement for local matching funds for this award. These funds will be available April 1, 2017 and will need to be expended by June 30, 2017. Costs permitted to be reimburse include personnel costs, travel and supplies. Continuing development and support of services will be accomplished through an additional award to be effective July 1, 2017.
