COUNTY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION OR COMMENTS: Recommend Approval

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

In prior fiscal years, Forsyth County has applied for and received multi-year grants from the N.C. Department of Public Safety – Governor's Crime Commission (GCC) Division to fund contracted positions for the Safe on Seven (SOS) Forsyth County Domestic Violence Center.


The 21st Judicial District Attorney's Office requests Forsyth County to apply for a two-year grant to continue the program. The proposed grant will be submitted to the N.C. Department of Public Safety – Governor's Crime Commission Division in the amount of \$112,867.16 for one year.

This grant will provide funding for one District Attorney's Office position and the SOS Program Coordinator.

A 25% match is required under the grant. The SOS Program will meet this match requirement by including volunteer/intern hours and the salary of a District Attorney's Domestic Violence Legal Assistant position funded by other sources. **No County Dollars will be included in this grant application. All matching funds will be provided by in-kind services or salaries funded by other sources.**

The purpose of this agenda item is to authorize execution of necessary documents for Forsyth County to apply for this GCC grant on behalf of the District Attorney's Office to support the SOS Program.

WHEREAS, the 21st Judicial District Attorney's Office requests that Forsyth County apply for a two-year Governor's Crime Commission continuation grant for FY 2019 and FY 2020 in the amount of \$112,867.16 for year one to support the Safe on Seven (SOS) Program, which provides an integrated team approach to prosecuting domestic violence cases with the assistance and support of the following organizations: Family Services, Inc., the Forsyth County Clerk of Court's Office, the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office, the Forsyth County Department of Social Services, Legal Aid Society of Northwest North Carolina, and the Winston-Salem Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the proposed grant will be used to fund one District Attorney's Office position and the SOS Program Coordinator position; and

WHEREAS, the proposed grant requires a 25% local match, which will be met by including volunteer/intern hours and the salary of a District Attorney's Domestic Violence Legal Assistant funded by the North Carolina Administrative Office of the Courts;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the submission of the above-described continuation grant application to the North Carolina Department of Public Safety-Governor's Crime Commission Division, on behalf of the 21st Judicial District Attorney's Office to support the Safe on Seven (SOS) Program, subject to a pre-audit certificate thereon by the County Chief Financial Officer, if applicable, and approval as to form and legality by the County Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners that the Chairman or County Manager and Clerk to the Board are hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of Forsyth County, any necessary documents to apply for the said grant as described herein on behalf of the 21st Judicial District Attorney's Office to support the Safe on Seven (SOS) Program, subject to a pre-audit certificate thereon by the County Chief Financial Officer, if applicable, and approval as to form and legality by the County Attorney.

Also the U.S. Department of Justice, Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) always host workshops at the FJC conference in which the staff and partners will attend in 2019.

Family Services operates North Carolina's oldest family shelter for victims of domestic violence. Specific services to families suffering from domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and human trafficking include 24 hour crisis intervention, safety planning, advocacy and support, individual and group counseling. Next Step Ministries in Kernersville NC provides shelter and crisis line services for that area.

Safe on Seven, a multi-disciplinary co-located, coordinated community response team, (FJC) provides services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault & stalking through on site access to Forsyth County District Attorney's Domestic Violence Unit, Family Services Inc., Legal Aid of NC, Clerk of Court, Forsyth Co. Sheriff's Office, Winston Salem Police Dept & referrals to community agencies. Victims of DV are able to obtain confidential legal assistance, advice, support, advocacy, safety plans, referrals, protective orders & information concerning their civil and criminal court cases. Victims are also able to receive information regarding resources that are available to them, how to access the resources & to be supported in making decisions that could affect their safety. The need for coordinated response to DV, SA, ST victims in Forsyth Co. is evidenced by SOS having served an approximately 21,000 victims seeking relief since opening in 2005. In 2016 Forsyth LE reported there were 5,008 incidents flagged as DV related during 2016. These incidents had 6,452 offenses charges. During 2016, there were 4,675 individuals, who had 6,278 victim involvements in DV incidents. In 2016 the DA's office reported that the total disposed dv cases was 2242. In 2018 1052 victims requested services at Safe on Seven, 993 50Bs and 50Cs were filed at Safe on Seven. SOS continues to demonstrate a dependable & reliable response to victims requesting assistance & has promoted safety and security.

Collaborative partners in this project include: Forsyth County District Attorney's Office (victim assistance & prosecution of DV, SA, ST cases); Clerk of Court (swears victim to DVPO, prepares case file for court/judge); Legal Aid of NC (staff and volunteer paralegals explain legal paperwork); Family Services (intake, advocacy, referrals & safety plan); Forsyth County Sheriff's Office (court security at DVPO exparte hearings, serves all DVPO in Forsyth County, talks with victim regarding safety and service of DVPO on abuser); Winston Salem Police Department (victim assistance services); Forsyth County Department of Social Services (referrals for victims requesting financial assistance programs); NC Department of Community Corrections (supervision of offenders).

Safe On Seven (SOS) will continue to provide access for all victims of DV, SA, ST in need of services by on site access to multiple agencies for the prosecution of civil and criminal DV, SA, ST cases; victim advocacy, safety planning, legal assistance & referrals to community agencies. Safe on Seven will utilize all efforts to continue to be a driving force in the community to help decrease domestic violence and sexual assault.

How will you use volunteers for this project?

Trained volunteers from Family Services, Inc and Legal Aid of NC will assist with work at the center. Volunteer duties include data entry, processing referrals, assisting with intake, advocacy and safety planning and legal assistance in regards to the legal paperwork and process of DVPO's. Legal Aid and Safe on Seven partner with Law Firm Womble Carlyle, Sandridge & Rice to provide paralegals to assist at Safe on Seven.

Who will be responsible for assisting victims with victims' compensation?

The District Attorney staff provides information and assistance with NC Victims Compensation applications. At initial contact, the DALA provides information on the availability of NC Victim Assistance to all victims and also sends written information to all victims involved in criminal cases. Other SOS staff provide applications and assistance with victims wishing to file.

Project Timeline of Activities:

The SOS project will continue, maintain and further refine the victim intake process, victim advocacy, civil legal process assistance, as well as provide focused prosecution of violent offenders. 1st Quarter: • Develop all appropriate contracts for involved partner agencies and develop any new procedural guidelines; • Maintain efficient service delivery to victims; 2nd Quarter: • Post and hire new staff if needed; • Provide training and orientation to staff as needed; 3rd Quarter: • Collect, evaluate and report on victim data, current practices and survey results to further develop program procedures and guide partners in program oversight; 4th - 8th Quarters: • Maintain service delivery and semi-annual assessment and evaluation of project.
