RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF NECESSARY DOCUMENTS
TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT, IF AWARDED, A LOCAL MITIGATION TO
THE OPIOID CRISIS GRANT THROUGH THE NORTH CAROLINA
DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC
HEALTH, INJURY AND VIOLENCE PREVENTION BRANCH
(FORSYTH COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH)

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, Injury and Violence Prevention Branch released a Request for Applications entitled, "Emergency Overdose: Local Mitigation to the Opioid Crisis for Local Health Departments and Districts"; and

WHEREAS, the request for applications allowed local health departments and districts to seek one-time, federal funds of up to \$100,000 to advance one or more strategies identified in the North Carolina Opioid Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Forsyth County Department of Public Health, in collaboration with Emergency Services and Twin City Harm Reduction, proposes to apply for funding under Strategy 1, "Establish or expand syringe exchange program(s) (SEPs)";

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the County Manager and Clerk to the Board to execute, on behalf of Forsyth County, the necessary documents to submit a Request for Application for a Local Mitigation to the Opioid Crisis Grant through the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, Injury and Violence Prevention Branch in the amount of \$100,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners that the Chairman or County Manager and Clerk to the Board are hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of Forsyth County, necessary documents to receive grant funds, if awarded, from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, Injury and Violence Prevention Branch to support the expansion of a syringe exchange program through Twin City Harm Reduction, subject to a pre-audit certificate thereon, by the Chief Financial Officer, where applicable, and approval as to form and legality by the County Attorney.
