RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FIRST REVISION TO THE COMMUNITY-BASED JUVENILE DELINQUENCY, SUBSTANCE ABUSE, AND GANG PREVENTION PLAN AND AUTHORIZING ITS SUBMISSION FOR STATE APPROVAL AND IMPLEMENTATION IN FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 (YOUTH SERVICES DEPARTMENT)

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2013, the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution Approving the Community-Based Juvenile Delinquency, Substance Abuse, and Gang Prevention Plan and Authorizing Its Submission for State Approval and Implementation for the 2013-2014 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, One Step Further, Incorporated received an allocation of \$13,005 in FY 2013-2014 to fund a Community Service/Restitution program, and subsequently One Step Further notified Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) that it would not fully expend this allocation; and

WHEREAS, Barium Springs Home for Children received an allocation of \$4,333 in FY 2013-2014 to fund Counseling Services to delinquent youth, and subsequently Barium Springs Home for Children notified Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) that it would not fully expend this allocation; and

WHEREAS, because Juvenile Crime Prevention Council funds which are not allocated and spent by the end of the calendar year will revert back to the State, the Forsyth County Juvenile Crime Prevention Council Allocations Committee developed a plan on May 15, 2014 to reallocate \$17,338 (\$13,005 allocated to One Step Further and \$4,333 to Barium Springs Home for Children); and

WHEREAS, based on a revised plan recommended by its Allocations Committee, the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council of Forsyth County approved and hereby submits to the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners a plan for the reallocation of \$17,338 in juvenile delinquency, substance abuse, and gang prevention funds for fiscal year 2013-2014 as follows:

2013-2014 Allocation Recommendation

Two Forsyth County JCPC funded programs (One Step Further and Barium Springs) reported expenditures below budgeted amounts at the 3rd Qt Accounting process. As a result, the two programs reverted funds back to the JCPC. The Executive Committee of the JCPC decided to retain the reverted funds for enhancements to currently funded JCPC programs.

Funds reverted back to the JCPC are as follows:

One Step Further Community Service/ Restitution reverted: \$13,005 Barium Springs Counseling reverted: \$4,333

Total available for redistribution: \$17,338
