EXPLANATION: The Forsyth County Department of Social Services (DSS) anticipates expending an additional \$600,000 by June 30, 2015 to fund mandated foster care services, supervised visitation services, and scanning services for adoptions records. Because the services impacted are partially reimbursable by State or federal funds, this Amendment to the FY 2014-2015 Budget Ordinance increases revenues and appropriations to DSS by the reimbursable amount of \$355,000. This transfer and amendment will not affect the County's General Fund balance.

Social Services Budget Revision to Comply with Anticipated Court Orders and Increased

Foster Care Child-Specific Placement Contracts

Forsyth County DSS is proposing a budget transfer and ordinance amendment to help it get through the 2014-15 fiscal year with no impact on the general fund. The department identifies two needs. First, due to court orders that could not have been foreseen during budget preparation, Forsyth County DSS anticipates expending \$450,000 over the budgeted amounts for Foster Care payments and supervised visitations. These costs are reimbursed at 70% and 35%, respectively. The second need is a 50% reimbursable expense to scan adoptions records and send the resulting microfilm to the State Department of Cultural Resources. This would free space in the records room at DSS. The proposed expenditures are shown below:

The department proposes to use 100% County dollar expenditures in Work First, Adoptions, and Special Assistance to fund the \$245,000 County dollars required and go to the Board for a budget amendment to recognize and appropriate the reimbursement revenues. The proposed decreases are shown below:

The Work First funds are budgeted for FCDSS TANF Maintenance of Effort. However, the department has already spent approximately \$3 million of the \$3.7 million required through workers' daysheet coding and will have no problem reaching the MOE without these funds. The Adoptions assistance payments and Special Assistance draft are 100% county funds and those OL3s will still have enough funds to cover the current year estimates. Budget preparation for FY16 will take the increased court orders for visitation services into account.
